Today is Good Shepherd Sunday. Jesus perfectly manifested sacrificial love as the Divine Shepherd. He was willing to go all the way for us, His sheep. He was willing to sacrifice everything. He did not let suffering, persecution, rejection and the like deter Him from His responsibility of caring for us in a total and complete way. It should inspire us, console us and encourage us to know how deep His love for us really is.

This love is seen, also, in the unwavering love of a parent, sibling, or dear friend. When the love one offers us is unwavering, especially in difficult times, this is a great support. Also love offered to another like this forges a deep spiritual bond that is stronger than any hardship we may face. No matter what "wolf" comes our way, we must know of the unwavering support of the Divine Shepherd and when we can see that love made manifest in the unwavering support of others, we are doubly blessed.

But the contrast should not be ignored either. Jesus gives the example of "a hired man who is not a shepherd" who sees the wolf coming and runs. We should see in this hired man the temptation we all inevitably face in life. It's hard to stick with it through the hard times. It's hard to be there for those who need us when they need us. It's hard to be faithful in all things and to never shy away in the face of the temptation of fear.

Jesus offers His unwavering love and support to us as our Shepherd, but He also wants us to return this gift to Him by offering this same unwavering commitment to one another.

How well do we imitate the Good Shepherd? Where we are lacking, let Him shepherd us so that we may shepherd others. Run to the Good Shepherd and trust in His perfect love for us.

Good Shepherd Sunday is also day of prayer for vocations to the Sacred Priesthood and today we also pray for our priests. Through life in the parish, the priest is present to people at different moments in the journey of faith: the joy of baptism and marriage, the high points of first Holy Communion and Confirmation, the sadness of sickness and suffering, the shock of tragedy, the grief of death and in the daily routine of everyday life. The Good Shepherd invites the priest to carry the wounded lamb on his shoulder and to model his life on Christ's own life, especially by carrying the cross.

A priest has a wonderful and challenging vocation – to stand between heaven and earth, to bring us the life of God, the forgiveness of God and the capacity to renew our lives. As every priest does this standing at the altar he is aware of his own unworthiness and that is why he and we at the beginning of Mass confess our unworthiness before listening to the Word of God and receiving the gifts, which will become the Body and Blood of Christ, given that we may be transformed. God's love and goodness is constant. Our priests make that love constantly present and bring us to meet face to face with God so that we can do so humbly, yet joyfully and with trust.

Christ is the good Shepherd who laid down his life for us. He knows us. May we always know him more and more so that he will be light for our personal journey, a love that is unique for each of us. For this we thank and praise him, the cornerstone of our faith and of our life.
